(music) Don't think I will even ask you to make Jesus Lord of your life. That's the most preposterous thing I could ever tell you to do.

Jesus Christ is Lord of your life. Whether you serve him or not, whether you bless him, curse him, hate him, or love him, he is the Lord of your life because God has given him a name that is above every name so that the name of Jesus Christ every knee shall bow and tongue confess that he is Lord. Some of you will bow out of the grace that has been given to you, and others will bow because your kneecaps will be broken by the one who rules the nations with a rod of iron.

And I'll not apologize for this God of the Bible.

(music) Hello everybody. This is the For the King podcast and I'm your host, Rocky Ramsey.

On this podcast we declare the edicts of the king, namely, that Yahweh reigns. I appreciate you guys tuning in. I know this is an unconventional episode, but there was a unconventional national thing that just happened that I want to speak on, and that would be the leaking of the abortion decision by the Supreme Court, a draft for a Supreme Court decision.

The decision was, majority decision affirming the abolition and the reversal of Roe v. Wade was by Justice Alito. And I just wanted to indict and provide some rhetoric from my point of view on the situation. One thing that really frustrates me about conservatives that call themselves Christians is the inconsistency in the Christian worldview in the positions that they take about political issues, or even in a situation like this where something even remotely close to their position actually comes through.

And there's a success, there's a victory that looks like it's a very conservative good victory. Yet, there are so many things that are inherently flawed and evil and wrong in what the Republican establishment is trying to push. The quote unquote conservative establishment is trying to push evil and iniquitous things that we should not rejoice with, that we can see it as a step in the right direction, but demand abolition, demand righteousness.

God does not compromise with sin. How does God interact with humanity? He demands righteousness. And if we want to be conformed to the image of Christ, we don't make peace with evil.

We don't compromise. That's not what Christians do. So, a good instance of this, just to speak to something else that's happening recently, the Don't Say Gay Bill in Florida with DeSantis, Governor DeSantis down there in Florida, you know, he is, the bill was basically saying that you're not allowed to talk about sexual things or sexual orientation in the classroom in public schools up until third grade.

And then after third grade, you're good to go. You can start brainwashing children into what's the best sexual orientation based on how they're feeling. You know, let's just make sure these kids, you know, whatever they want, right, in their their foolish youth, let's just let's encourage whatever they're conjuring up in their mind.

So, what is DeSantis assuming? What's his presupposition in ruling that way or going that way? One, that public school is a right of the state to allow and to fund and to provide education to the populace and the state is going to do that from the state's position, which is secularism. That's assumption number one. All the conservatives say, oh, look at DeSantis.

He's our guy. You know, we love this man. He's great.

You know, same thing with Trump and the conservatives all saying Trump's great. These dudes are wicked non-Christian people that we do not like. We do not support them.

And they tickle the ears of conservative people that are supposed to be Christians. And, yeah, the things that they would be doing would be hard left, you know, in the 1950s. Today's conservatives are just yesterday's liberals.

Trump, I mean, Trump literally sent thousands of dollars in stimulus checks to the American people. If that's not big government, hard left ideology, I don't know what is. Same thing with DeSantis.

After third grade, we can start teaching our kids about their sexual orientation, whether they want to be gay or they want to be straight or if they even want to know how to perform sexual acts and all these things. We can we can groom them. We can teach them about sex after, you know, the third grade.

The state can do that. That's just one example. Now, the example here with Alito's decision.

So he does a good job in the decision writing about the historical precedence that Roe v. Wade was established on. Good. OK, good.

He refutes that and undoes that. That's fine. But what's he what is his what is his position? What is he doing in the decision? He's saying that the issue of abortion should be left up to the states.

The state should be the ones that decide whether or not to murder a baby. It is so inconsistent that, first of all, he's supposed to be representing the conservative Republican position. And this is what he's coming up with.

Also, he's arguing from a position that these babies aren't humans and they're not made in the image of God, that it's up to the states to decide what they're going to do with

that issue that concerns the mothers and not that this is a baby made in the image of God. So when conservatives and people that call themselves Christians and a lot of people are Christians, I'm not saying they're not Christians, but, you know, I was talking to somebody this week and, you know, they were saying, oh, look how awesome. This is look how good this is.

It's just such a leftist tactic to, you know, they take a mile and then they give you an inch right when they need it. So, I mean, obviously, this is going to be a rallying cry for the midterm elections coming up when everybody's going to say, hey, look, these women are getting their rights taken away for abortion. We really need to show out in this midterm election.

We need to rally the troops and all the leftists are going to come out to vote to make sure they can remain in power, that kind of thing. I mean, you know, it's always, you know, how are these things going to be used? How are they going to use them for their own gain at the national level, the federal level? You know, we don't know exactly how it's going to be used, but what we can say is that this is not a good thing. This is not righteousness.

This is iniquity. This is evil. God looks at what Alito wrote and how would God respond to that? God would say, this is evil.

This transgresses my law. I abhor this. That's what God would say.

What should the Christians say in this country? They should demand righteousness. They should demand that our rulers that are over us, that are deaconates, they're deacons of God. The civil magistrate is a holy position that you've been given, if you've been elected, to that role in our society.

They're a deacon of God and they should be doing God's will. And for Alito, Justice Alito, to write a decision that's enabling the states to decide whether or not they should be murdering babies, that's iniquitous and evil in the eyes of God. So what I say that Christians should do is agree with God.

Based on his word, we can confidently say that Alito's decision is iniquitous and evil because he wants to leave the states, the hands of the states are the ones dishing out, either protecting life or destroying it. It's up to the states to deliver that. So one statement I want to make about this is abortion is pre-political.

It's pre-political. It's not something that's politicized that you need to determine based on your politic, the way you want to govern, the way you're deriving laws as a person. Abortion's not that kind of issue where you need to decipher what you ought to do.

It's pre-political. It's a position that the state doesn't figure out. There's no precedence that needs to be set.

The Constitution is the... I'm sorry, not infallible. The Constitution is the baseline foundational precedence that this whole country is judging their laws on. That's what the founding fathers thought.

It's the initial precedence that's set and then the court can establish precedence after that based on always referring back to the Constitution, not reinterpreting it or adding to it. So, yeah, sorry, I told you it's the wrong word. Not infallible.

I meant foundational. The Constitution is the foundational document that the country's politic is founded on. And what's the Constitution founded on? God-given rights, the Scriptures, the revealed word of God.

So that's my word on that. That's what I think is best. That's what I think you should think.

That's what I think. Conservatives are just so ridiculously stupid nowadays. And the way that Christians argue just baffle my mind.

We do not rejoice in iniquity. We don't... Obviously, this is a step in the right direction. And we want to recognize that.

But it's one battle won in a long, long war. And what conservatives will do a lot of the time is they will win a small battle and say, "Wow, look, we won this small battle." And then they will give up and they will not continue pushing the antithesis to return back to conservative values, which are... When I say conservative values, I'm talking about Christian values. I'm talking about the word of God.

That's what conservatism is. It's not just saying I'm a conservative because I grew up this way or my granddad thought this or whatever. I'm talking about infinite, timeless, eternal truth based on God's word.

That's what conservatism is. So, yeah, I mean, I hope that was helpful what I'm saying here. And I hope you understand exactly what I'm getting at.

Abortion is pre-political. It's not a politicized issue. That's what Alito should have penned in his decision.

He did a great job on the historical analysis that there's absolutely no precedent set in the Supreme Court prior to Roe v. Wade or any time in our nation's history that abortion is a right for a mother. That she should be able to murder her child in the womb. That's not in our legal history at all.

So, Alito does a good job there. But then he leaves it open to the states and he doesn't establish biblical law, constitutional law that ensures the rights of individuals to not be murdered. That's what would be the prudent wise thing to do.
